MusicLink teachers are qualified, professional teachers seeking to share their love of music with a deserving child. All MusicLink teachers are required to pass a criminal background check paid for by the foundation.

Students are nominated by music specialists, youth coordinators, choir directors, parents or anyone who has a knowledge of the musical potential of the child. Parents are asked to provide documentation to verify financial eligibility.

Originally from Bulgaria, Dr. Atanasova has had the opportunity to perform solo and chamber music in Europe and the United States. She was honored to receive an invitation to play all-Chopin program in a concert with special guest, the Polish ambassador to Bulgaria. Among her most recent accomplishments in the United States was her participation in the Billboard Latin Music Awards. She was also delighted to be invited to perform at a concert with guest of honor Caroline Kennedy, a former US ambassador.

As a pianist with diverse interests, Dr. Atanasova has explored the vast opportunities offered in the world of dance as well. She has worked with the Ballet Department at the University of Nevada, Las Vegas, where she has also earned her Doctor of Musical Arts Degree in Piano Performance. On her musical journey, Dr. Atanasova has performed numerous recitals and collaborated with great names in classical music as well as in pop culture.

As a pianist who suffered a professionally inflicted injury in 2011, Dr. Atanasova was inspired to publish a book focused on piano and wellness as she realizes the importance of healthy technique and movement and aspires to spread knowledge and awareness on this topic. She also desires to inspire those who seek innovative, exciting, and challenging works to expand their repertoire and incorporate pieces from the one-handed realm.

The title of the book is: "One-Handed Piano Compositions and Injury Awareness, History, Study of Selected Works and Mindful Practice." It was published by Lexington Books an Imprint of Rowman & Littlefield. Truly dedicated to music and performance, Dr. Atanasova feels equally comfortable playing and singing on the classical and pop stage, in academic atmosphere, and among contemporary artists.


