Kassandra has performed as a soloist, collaborative artist, and chamber musician in recitals, master classes, workshops, and music festivals in the United States, Canada, England, and Austria. She is very active with Music Teachers National Association (MTNA) on the local, state, and division levels, has served MTNA in many varying positions, and has presented at state and national conferences on piano-related topics. Kassandra currently serves as the MTNA Southwest Division Director, the Arizona State Music Teachers Association membership chair, and coordinates the MTNA Composition Competition's Southwest Division. She has taught piano, music, and music theory for 25+ years.

Kassandra is also certified through MTNA as a nationally certified teacher of music (NCTM) in piano, and the Royal Conservatory of Music (RCM) as an elementary and intermediate piano teaching specialist.

BRYAN CHUAN



Bryan Chuan is lecturer of piano at the University of Nevada Reno and maintains an active career as a performer, collaborative artist and pedagogue. He has been a featured soloist with the Denver Pops Orchestra, Reno Chamber Orchestra, UNR Symphony Orchestra, Harvard Pops Orchestra and Northeastern Wind Symphony. His recent solo recitals have included the works of Enrique Granados and a survey of Basque organ music. As music director at Trinity Episcopal Cathedral, he directs the Pipes on the River concert series, which features guest organists from around the country and collaborative performances with local musicians and organ. He is part of a recent album release by BIS records featuring the world premiere of vocal and chamber music works by Kaikhosru Sorabji.

Bryan received his DMA in piano performance from the University of Colorado Boulder, with previous education at the University of Nevada Reno and Harvard University.



JONATHAN RHODES



Jonathan Rhodes Lee has performed as harpsichord soloist and continuo player across North America and Europe. He can be heard on the MSR, Equilibrium, and Navona labels and has appeared with ensembles such as Mercury Baroque (Houston), the New Century Chamber Orchestra (San Francisco), the Las Vegas Sinfonietta, the Nevada Chamber Orchestra, the San Antonio Symphony, and others.

Lee holds degrees from the San Francisco Conservatory of Music and the University of California, Berkeley, and he was a Fulbright Scholar at the Royal Conservatory of Music in The Hague, Netherlands. His teachers have included Laurette Goldberg, Joscelyn Godwin, Davitt Moroney, and Jacques Ogg.

Lee serves as Associate Professor of Music at the University of Nevada, Las Vegas, where his work as a musicologist focuses on eighteenth-century repertoires and film music. His book, Film Music in the Sound Era, appeared with Routledge in 2020, and his articles have appeared in the Journal of Musicology, Eighteenth-Century Music, Cambridge Opera Journal, Music and Letters, and elsewhere. His edition of previously undiscovered harpsichord music of Pierre-Nicolas La Font appeared with A-R Editions in 2016. Lee is also Director of the Arnold Shaw Popular Music Research Center and the university's Early Music Ensemble.

KA-WAI YU



Cellist and viol player Ka-Wai Yu is Associate Professor of Music at Utah Tech University, where he teaches cello and directs the string chamber music program. Originally from Hong Kong, he has performed as a soloist and chamber musician at many major concert halls in Canada, China, Germany, Japan, Singapore, South Korea, Taiwan and the United States, and is currently the Principal Cellist of Southwest Symphony Orchestra. A recipient of scholarships from Early Music America and the Viola da Gamba Society of America, Dr. Yu has performed with such period-instrument ensembles as Cosmopolitan Baroque, La Réunion Musicale, Concentus, and the Viol Consort of Champaign-Urbana, and has performed at the American Bach Soloists Academy, Early Music Vancouver, and the Boston Early Music Festival Fringe.

He directs the bi-annual Southern Utah Early Music Festival. Dr. Yu holds a D.M.A. in Cello Performance and Literature from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, and B.A. and M.M. from the Chinese University of Hong Kong and Indiana University's Jacobs School of Music. He has studied with baroque cellist Jaap ter Linden and viola da gambist Wendy Gillespie. He has also worked with Tanya Tomkins, Elisabeth Reed, Robert Mealy, Wilbert Hazelzet, and Sandra Miller, among others.

GREGORY MALDONADO





Gregory Maldonado has 40 years' experience conducting professional ensembles, and has also performed on the violin and viola for over 45 years in many professional orchestras, including Philharmonic Baroque Orchestra, Los Angeles Opera, Long Beach Opera, Santa Fe Pro Musica/Santa Fe Opera, Monterey Symphony, Fresno Philharmonic, and the Las Vegas Philharmonic. He also worked as a violinist and violist accompanying popular artists such as Glen Campbell, Carol Channing, Sammy Davis, Jr., Liza Minnelli, Frank Sinatra, Jackie Evancho, as well as Martin Fontaine as Elvis Presley in "The Elvis Experience."

Additionally, he was Principal Conductor and Leader of the Los Angeles Baroque Orchestra, a critically acclaimed period-instrument ensemble, for two decades.

He holds a doctorate degree from USC, a master's from CSULB, and a bachelor's from UCLA. He taught for over 25 years at many universities and colleges, including UCLA, USC, CSULB, UNLV, and CSN. Dr. Maldonado teaches in the Clark County School District—he is Director of Orchestra at West Career and Technical Academy, Las Vegas, and was a Finalist for the 2022 and 2023 "Heart of Education Award." He served as Director of the Las Vegas Youth Orchestra Concert Strings division from 2016 to 2019 and has been a judge and clinician for music festivals and competitions in California, Nevada, and Utah for over 30 years. Maestro Maldonado is Artistic Director and Principal Conductor of the Nevada Chamber Orchestra and also served as Guest Conductor of the Nouveau Chamber Ballet and the San Diego Chamber Orchestra. He is an AFM Local 369 member and has recorded on the Harmonia Mundi, RCM, Centaur, and Rococo labels.

DR TIMOTHY HOFT



Dr. Timothy Hoft is an Associate Professor at the University of Nevada, Las Vegas, where he teaches solo and collaborative piano. A pianist of unique versatility, Timothy Hoft has been praised for his recent performances. "Hoft's objective approach to performing new music was especially successful...[his] precise control of dynamics and quiet approach to the keyboard with a perfect technique led to a beautiful, automatic sense of music making..." (Michael Lodico, Ionarts.org). His debut CD, Reflections on Ukrainian Piano Music Vol. I, has also been favorably reviewed. "Here is piano music that needs to be known, piano music that abounds with visceral vibrancy and expressive intensity, not to mention being skillfully and subtly wrought for the instrument. Timothy Hoft's ardent and caring virtuosity is captured in superb, lifelike sonics. You can't ask for a more auspicious start to what promises to be an important series." Hoft has given performances as soloist and chamber musician in the concert halls of Ukraine, Russia, Poland, France, Italy, the Czech Republic, England, Scotland, and the U.S., including Carnegie Hall's Weill Recital Hall, the John F. Kennedy Center, the Phillips Collection, the Yamaha Piano Salon, the Ukrainian Institute of America, the Hobby Center for the Performing Arts, and the Smith Center. He has performed with ensembles such as the Lviv Philharmonic, Phillips Camerata, Peabody Camerata, Peabody Wind Ensemble, UNLV Symphony Orchestra, UNLV Wind Ensemble, Henderson Symphony Orchestra and the Detroit Civic Symphony Orchestra.

Hoft is currently exploring and performing solo piano repertoire of 20th and 21st century Ukrainian composers, including the Nocturnals of Virko Baley, the piano sonatas of Valentin Silvestrov, the monumental cycle of 34 Preludes and Fugues by Valentin Bibik, the piano sonatas of Boris Lyatoshynsky, and others, for a series of recordings entitled Reflections on Ukrainian Piano Music, to be released on the Troppe Note/Cambria label.

A graduate of the University of Michigan and the Peabody Conservatory, Hoft holds Bachelor's, Master's, and Doctoral Degrees in piano performance. His primary teachers were Logan Skelton and Benjamin Pasternack. During his graduate studies, Hoft was awarded a fellowship through the La Gesse Foundation, giving him numerous performances in Europe and in the U.S. He was also granted the Earl Wild Scholarship of the Ivory Classics Foundation, allowing him to study with the legendary pianist, Earl Wild.


In 2006, Ore graduated from the University of Nevada, Las Vegas, receiving a Master of Music with a dual emphasis in vocal performance and piano accompaniment.

AMY HOMER-SMITH




